

Key to Detailed Sketch No. 30.

A A M L I.

58°46'N. - 08°30'E.
3740 - 4090/E38W.

1. "Turistheimen" (Hotel), partly used as German quarters.
2. Landmines have been laid at the western end of the bridge (in the open space where the 3 roads meet).
3. Aamfoss (Aamli) bridge. 81.8 m. long (2 spans - stone arch) Guarded by the Germans.
4. "Bedehus" (Chapel). German food store. Guarded by 8 men quartered at Point 8.
5. House belonging to Roverud. Living quarters for the Germans (4 men) guarding the bridge.
6. Tallak Dale's shop. German food store in the cellar. Dale is the mayor of Aamli "herred" and a member of Nasjonal Samling (Quisling Party).
7. Aamli Railway station. One of the huts here is used by the Germans as food store.
8. "Prestegården" (Parsonage). Quarters for the Germans at the A.O.P. (Point 9) and the guard at Point 4.
9. A.O.P. on Tveitheia. Telephone line to the exchange at Aamli. The crew (8-10 men) is quartered at Point 8.

There is no report about the quantity of food stored at Aamli.

Landmines have been laid on the Arendal road at a place called "Århuskleiva". This place has not been located.

At Lillemo, approximately 2 km. north of the village, a petrol tank, capacity 13.2 m³, belonging to the Norwegian Ministry of Transport.
